	Prophets** are the most important source of authority for a Muslim. Evaluate this statement	Could be Prophets, Holy books or the imamate (Shi'a Islam).
Characteristics of Allah	** is the best way to understand the nature of Allah. Evaluate this statement	Could be omnipotence, beneficence, mercy, fairness and justice, including different ideas about God's relationship with the world: immanence and transcendence.
Key beliefs/articles of faith	The ***** is the most important article of faith for Muslims. Evaluate this statement	Could be day of judgement, angels, predestination, Akhirah, Tawid,
	Predestination suggests that there is no need for a day of judgement. Evaluate this statement.	
	Predestination suggests that humans have no freedom. Evaluate this statement	
	For Muslims ** is the most important Angel. Evaluate this statement	Could be Jibril, Mikai'l or Izrail
	All Muslims share the same beliefs. Evaluate this statement	Should include five roots of Usul as-Din and six articles of faith. Need similarities and differences between the two sect – Shia and Sunni
